Smell can both transport and direct. This exhibition includes scents that relate to travel, migration, immigration, navigation and transportation. There are scents of places that will be familiar, unfamiliar, reachable and unreachable. It includes scents from very specific times and places as well as smells of imaginary, otherworldly and mundane places. *Scents of Movement, Scents of Place* touches on broad notions of life, death, myriad world views, subjectivity, colonization and what we can know through our nose.

Riaz Mehmood: Ghazal—Songs for Home October 22, 2022 - January 29, 2023

This exhibition is a tribute to Riaz Mehmood's homeland in Kyhber Pakhtunkhwa, along the Pakistan-Afghanistan border. In video, photography, painting and textile, Mehmood presents moments of memory, joy, syncretism and resilience through an exploration of poetry, song, dance and the landscape. Countering deep-rooted and persistent colonial stereotypes, *Ghazal—Songs for Home* is a celebration of Pashtun culture and identity in all its complexity and beauty.

Road Trip October 22, 2022 - January 29, 2023

This exhibition features almost 100 works of art from the AGA collection that represent some of the most iconic images of the road trip: vehicles, highways, hotels, landscape vistas and popular destinations. Including work in all media, the exhibition takes us on a drive through scenes from both our past and present. The works are both representational and fantastical, with artists documenting the world around us and creating new landscapes and imaginary vistas.

Dean Drever: Pass the Hat November 25, 2022 – April 16, 2023

Dean Drever's *Pass the Hat* is a 16-foot totem pole made of 10,686 pieces of paper. This piece reconstitutes traditional totem pole construction through contemporary industrial processes. Totems sustain and relay cultural narratives and stories of clan lineage, history and family. The bear and the thunderbird are illustrative symbols of power and domination, but they are also symbols of resistance and responsibility.


